Honorable guests included WVSRPA Past President Sandy Latimer, NRA Senior Field Representative James Kilgore, Keith Morgan President of the West Virginia Civil Defense League and other members.

The meeting was called to order by President Gary Bailey at noon with the pledge to the flag, Gary made some announcements and the invocation was given by Pam Kilgore.

Following lunch the annual business meeting began with the reading of the minutes from the 2012 Annual Meeting. *Vice President Tom Hayden motioned to accept the minutes as read, Director Jim Canon seconded, Motion carried.

The treasurer's report from Amy Tenney was reviewed from the information printed in the program, Amy explained that the remaining grant monies were spent on various items and so it appears that the association spent more than we actually did. Amy also shared that she felt she had not been keeping track of donations to the association as well as she could have, but she said she will make an effort to keep better track of them from now on. *Director Lynn Burnside motioned to accept the treasurers report, Wanda Shank seconded. Motion Carried.

President Gary Bailey asked for the Audit Committee Report, Director Delores Williams Spoke for the committee saying that the audit had been done and that as of Jan-Feb 2013 the Books are up to date and correct. *Vice President Tom

Hayden motioned to accept the report of the Audit Committee. Director Lynn Burnside seconded. Motion Carried.

At this time the Association membership welcomed guest speaker Keith Morgan from the West Virginia Civil Defense League. Mr. Morgan shared with the association what the civil defense league has been doing over the past few months, Stating that he believed that we are living in times that an old Chinese blessing wishes "May you live in 'interesting' times". He shared information concerning several pieces of legislation that are present in the works in Charleston that are designed to improve gun rights for West Virginia. (noting HB2760-HB2572-SB408-SB369) Mr. Morgan also said that there is a website for the civil defense league, www.wvcdl.org and that they have a Facebook page.

Guest Speaker James Kilgore, NRA Senior Field Representative, spoke concerning the Friends of NRA Programs in West Virginia, saying that the Midland Trail Event held in Charleston on February 28th, had been very successful. He also said it was the beginning of what could be the best year ever for the program. Mr. Kilgore said the State Grant meeting would be held on the 23rd of March and that the Committee had 110 thousand dollars to grant, this the most money every raised by the Friends program to give via grants in West Virginia. Mr. Kilgore announced that the association's longtime friend Bill Shank has been chosen as the volunteer of the year for West Virginia, and that NRA had also chosen Bill as the Eastern Region Volunteer of the Year. Bill and wife Wanda will be attending the NRA National Meetings in Houston Texas, as part of his award and he will receive a plaque and recognition at the Nation Friends of NRA event there.

Mr. Kilgore then said he wanted to add a personal word and that he was no longer speaking as an NRA Foundation employee. Jim said that gun owners and those of us who believe in the 2nd amendment are in a terrible battle to keep our rights. He encouraged everyone to call their state and national representatives to help in the fight.

At this time Gary asked Vice President Tom Hayden to take over concerning the nominations

and elections for terms that expired or are vacant. The following nominations were made:

Because there were no nominations from the floor during the open nominations, Tom Hayden motioned to acclaim that the aforementioned were elected by unanimous vote. Jim Canon seconded. The motion carried.

Committee Reports

Sandy Latimer reported that there will be about 17 shooters going to Perry this summer.

Bill Shank reported on the Junior Smallbore team, announcing a number of awards and introducing the young shooters. Bill also reported the West Virginia University Rifle Team won their 15th NCAA Championship.

Ed Tenney reported that Whitehorse Center will open to shooters April 3rd. Ed said everything worked out very well when a concealed carry course was given at Whitehorse. All parts of the class could be undertaken at the Whitehorse facility.

J. R. Hill and Jim Pennington reported concerning Legislation. The Code on the books concerning not shooting a firearm within 500 feet of an inhabited dwelling, is unpecific. This is being addressed in the State legislature. Help being enlisted from Del Hamilton from Upshire County the adjustment and more exact wording will be addressed in House Bill 2866.

The Door prizes and 50-50 were draw. Everyone enjoying the 'white elephant' gifts and Jim Kilgore winning the 50-50. The Kimber pistol raffle was drawn, the winner Ed Sites! (small bore coach) A few nice donated items were auctioned to the membership, adding a bit to our treasury.

PCGC Smallbore Team News

Three PCGC Junior Smallbore Shooters went to the Spring Fling Regional Smallbore Tournament at the NRA Range in Fairfax VA, 20-21 April 2013. This was a 3-Position Indoor 50 yard Tournament. There were 60 shooters including a 2000 and 2008 Olympic Shooter.

Jason Black won the Gold Medal in the Prone Junior Sharpshooter Class with a score of 398-32x.

Noah Barker won the Bronze Medal in both the Prone and Kneeling Inter-mediate Junior Marksman Class. He had a Prone score was 397-18x and a Kneeling score of 387-9x.

Brassmasters' Activities and Events

2012 was a busy one for Brassmasters and 2013 appears to be even busier. With our 2012 Friends of NRA Grant we increased our firing line to 24 electronically-timed turning targets and constructed a 100' x 12' firing line cover at the Bullseye Range.

We also held the WV State Outdoor Pistol Championships in the fall and drew competitors from throughout WV, NC, VA, OH, PA, MD, NY and Canada. Additionally, we held our first NRA Women on Target Clinic, with renown competitive shooter and instructor Kimberly Hobart traveling from Ohio to serve as Clinic Director.

Brassmasters' members Alan and Cindi Cleland held several concealed carry classes at our range during 2012. One of our primary goals was also reached in 2012, increasing our membership more than three-fold over what it was in 2011. Not only is this membership increase important toward expanding shooting activities at our ranges, but to put the financial aspect of operating a shooting-oriented organization into proper perspective, it requires 22 members' dues just to pay the premium for our liability insurance coverage.

2013 holds many challenges for us such as, plans to construct two new desperately needed combination stat offices/refreshment stands/storage buildings at our ranges; one at the Bullseye Range and the other at the Cowboy Action/Silhouette Ranges. Additionally, holding an NRA Women on Target Clinic in July, a monthly Women's Night at the Range, (women only) followed by a pot-luck dinner; resurrecting the Mountaineer Regional Championships; and, the annual WV Strawberry Festival 1800 & Service Pistol Matches, the 2013 WV State Outdoor Pistol Championships and Cowboy Action Matches, along with monthly Bullseye matches. We also plan to continue holding a 50/50 drawing at all of our Bullseye matches, with

the proceeds donated to help offset expenses of the WWSRPA Pistol Teams at Camp Perry.

West Virginia State Rifle and Pistol Association Legislative Committee **By: JR Hill & Jim Pennington, Co-Chairs**

In the fall of 2012, the WWSRPA Board of Directors decided that the association needed to have their voice heard in the WV Legislature. From that decision, JR Hill and Jim Pennington were appointed co-chairs of the Legislative Committee.

Since it had been years, possibly decades since the state association had a legislative committee, the co-chairs decided not to bite off more than they could chew during their freshmen year and to choose their objectives carefully.

Two objectives immediately appeared on our radar screen and we both agreed, along with encouragement from the association's president, Gray Bailey that we would tackle them. The first was the glaring omission of information regarding West Virginia's Concealed Carry Law from the attorney general's Web site. The former attorney general maintained a "Concealed Carry Law Tab" which one could click on and it transferred you to a listing of states that WV had reciprocity agreements with and a color-coded map of the 50 states illustrating same. Additionally, it also informed the reader of the requirements to obtain a concealed carry permit.

Apparently, when newly elected Attorney General Morrissey assumed office, the office's Web site was revamped and the information regarding concealed carry laws and reciprocity were deleted. The committee co-chairs were of the opinion that the concealed carry law and reciprocity information were invaluable to West Virginia's firearms owners and those holding a concealed carry permit or contemplating applying for one.

With this in mind, on behalf of the association, we penned a letter to Attorney General Morrissey urging him to include information regarding concealed carry laws in WV and reciprocity agreements with the several other states on his Web site. In a diplomatic fashion we reminded the attorney general that a major plank of his campaign platform was his stated strong support of Second Amendment rights and further, we were confident that a majority of WV gun owners supported his

candidacy for that reason. Although we have no way of confirming it, however, within mere days after mailing the letter, the Web site was upgraded to include concealed carry laws and information regarding reciprocity. For WV concealed carry permit holders that travel to other states, this information should prove invaluable to avoid knowingly violating other states' CC laws.

The second objective the legislative committee chose was to ask Delegate Bill Hamilton of the 45th District (R-Upshur Co.) to introduce a bill in the WV House of Delegates that would change the present WV Code 20-2-58, which prohibited discharging a firearm within 500 feet of a dwelling; even if that dwelling was your own. So, if your nearest neighbor is six miles away, it would still be illegal to shoot within 500 feet of your own house. Fortunately, Delegate Hamilton was very receptive to sponsoring this legislation. He was able to marshal the support of Delegates A. Evans, Andes, Ireland, Walker, Moye, Lynch, P. Smith, J. Nelson Frich and Sponaugle. The Legislative Committee is pleased to report that HB 2866 passed the WV Legislature and was signed into law by the governor on April 29th.

An abstract of 2866:

AN ACT to amend and reenact §20-2-58 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, relating to the prohibited discharge of firearms in proximity to buildings, public roads and crowds; providing a limited and conditional exception to allow a resident of a dwelling house, and his or her authorized guest, to discharge a firearm in a lawful manner within five hundred feet of the dwelling house where the resident lives, subject to certain conditions; conditions giving rise to exception; increasing the distance between where a person is permitted to discharge a firearm in relation to a school or church; and establishing misdemeanor criminal penalties for violations.

The WWSRPA Legislative Committee thanks Delegate Hamilton and HB 2866 co-sponsors' for their support. We also want to extend our appreciation to the WV Division of Natural Resources, Law Enforcement Section for their well-received suggestions which added more clarity to the bill. Specifically, suggesting to Delegate

Hamilton that HB 2866 include "house guests" too and that the distance for firing adjacent to a church or school be increased from 400 feet to 500 feet. This suggestion also provided continuity regarding distances for discharging firearms and a wider safety zone.

In summary, although these were relatively small objectives, they both resulted in what could be considered victories for WV gun owners, hunters and landowners. As the 2014 legislative session approaches, we hope to develop a political agenda that identifies legislation important to WV gun owners and sportsmen to which the WWSRPA chooses to support on behalf of its membership.
